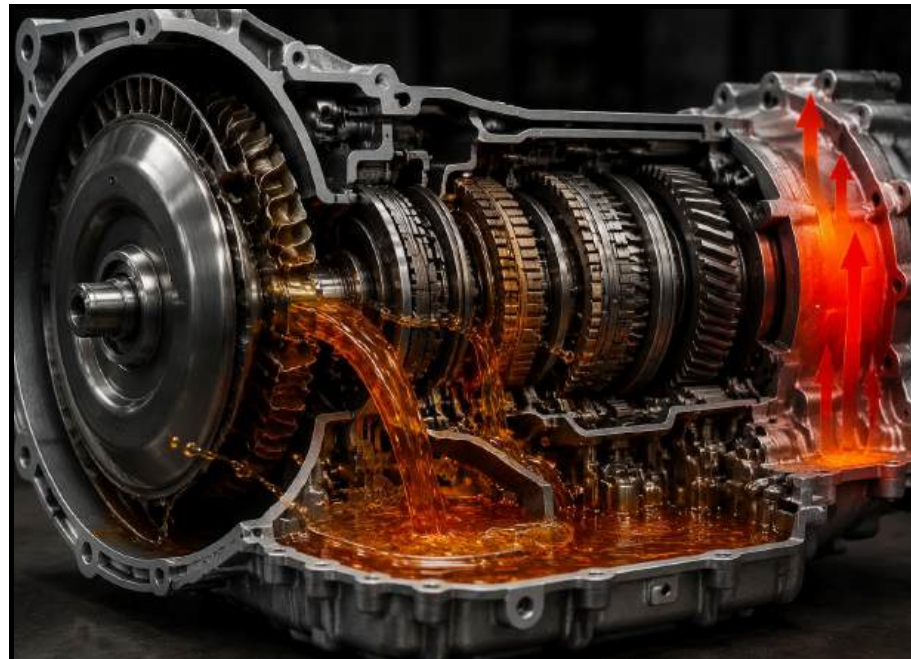


Reasons Skipping Audi Transmission Service Is Costly

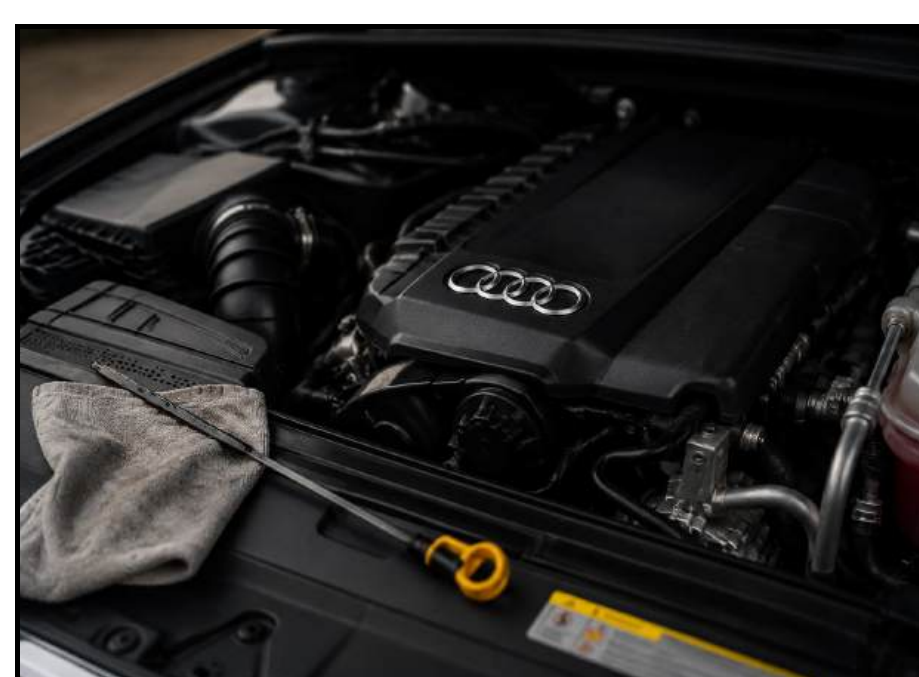
1. Why Transmission Fluid Matters More Than Many Owners Realize

Transmission fluid lubricates, manages heat, and maintains hydraulic pressure, but it breaks down over time, causing harder work, rougher shifts, and unseen wear.



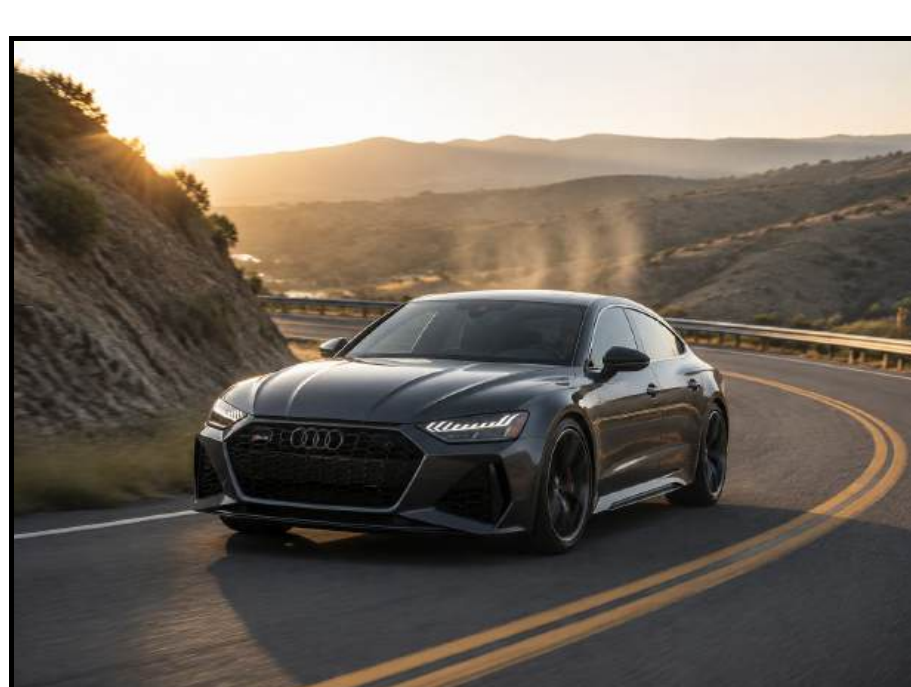
2. The Problem with "Lifetime Fluid"

"Lifetime" transmission fluid is misleading; all fluid degrades over time, and used or unserviced units can accumulate hidden stress even if they feel fine.



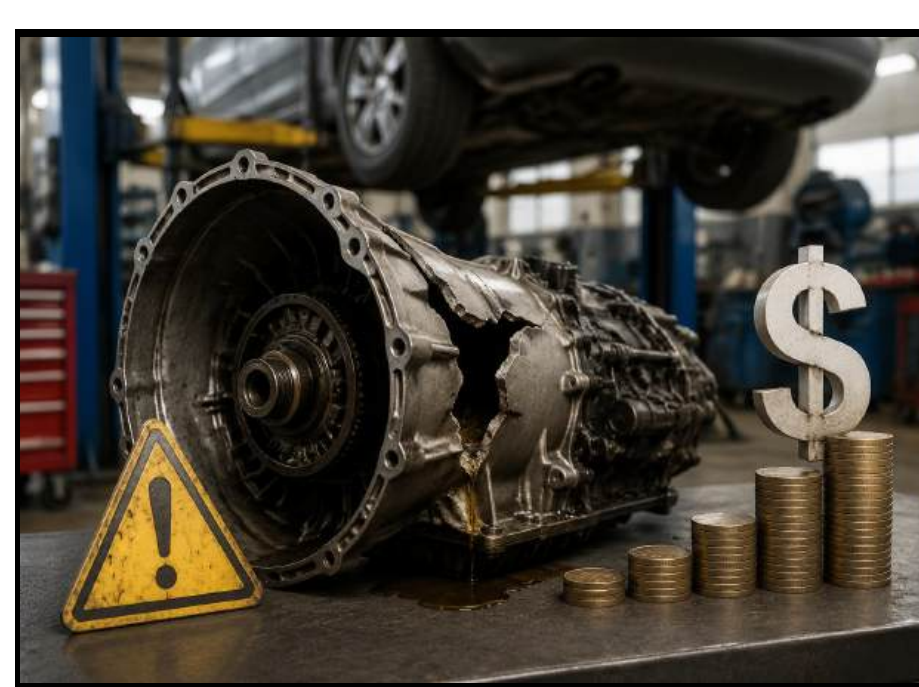
3. Performance Driving Speeds Up Wear

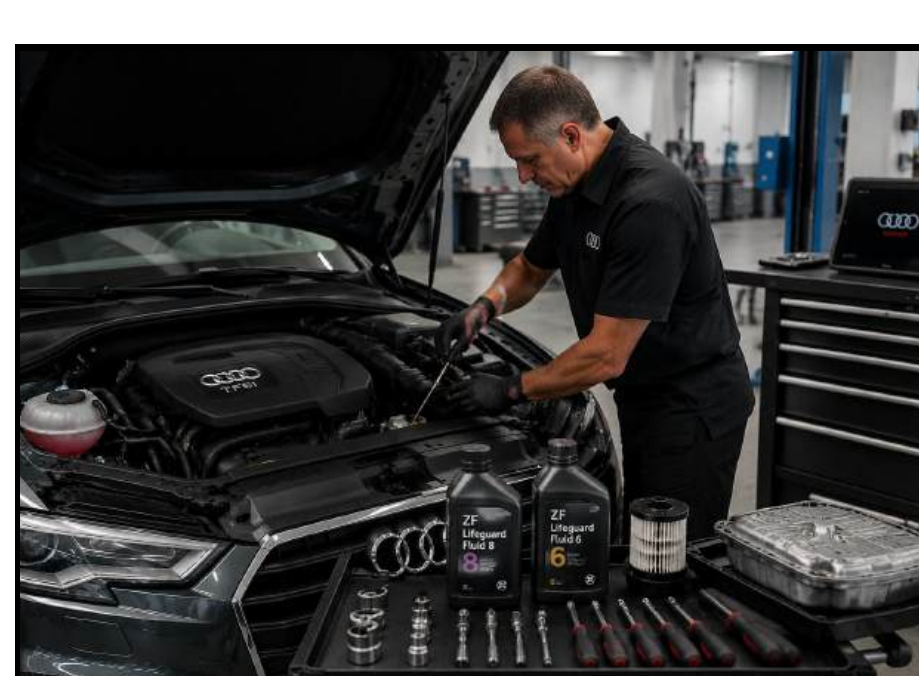
5. How to Stay Ahead of Trouble

The best approach is simple. Know your service interval, monitor shift quality, shorten intervals for aggressive or hot driving, and address changes early to avoid mechanical damage.



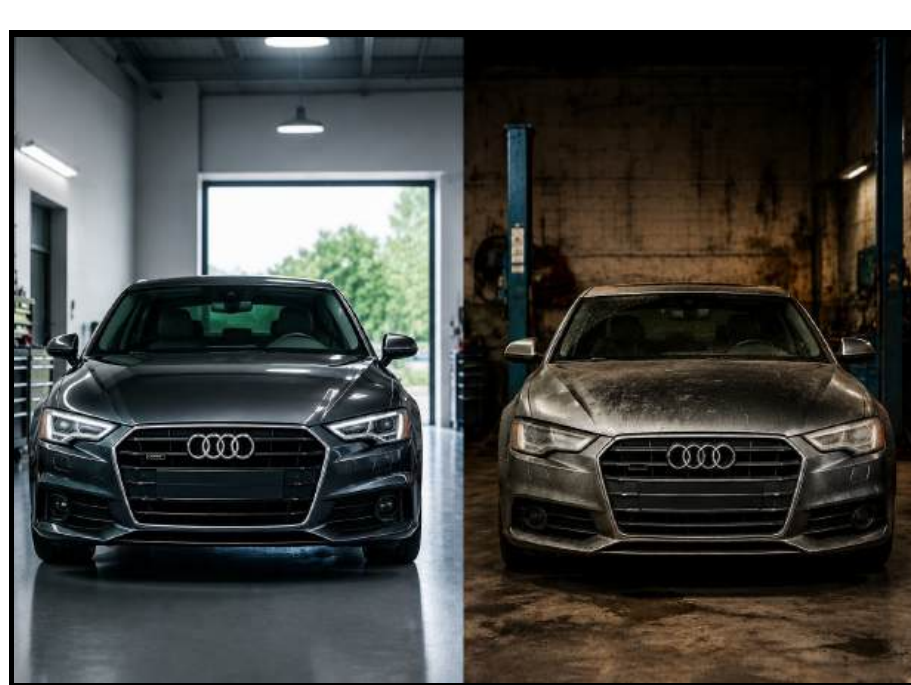
6. Why Specialist Service Matters with Audi Transmissions
